Poultry Banding & Meeting

All poultry exhibiting at the fair must be identified with a leg band. Bands are required to show at the Greenwood County Fair. U.S. Pollorum-Typhoid testing will not be required this year. However, poultry, except waterfowl, originating from other states must be tested. Please contact the Extension Office if your bird needs to be tested. The date for banding will be Wednesday, June 12th at 5pm at the fairgrounds. There will be a project meeting after birds have been banded.

Lamb Lead-In Contest



It has been said that March comes in like a Lion and goes out like a Lamb. Hopefully that means calm and easy to lead for 4-Hers and others who might like to enter the Lamb Lead-In contest at the Greenwood County

Fair. This contest has been a popular and fun one and now is the time to think ahead for entering this year's event. The Lamb Lead-In contest is open to anyone, there are classes for 6 years and under, ages 7 - 9, 10 - 13, 14 -18, and adult. It is listed in the Open Class section of the Fair paper and is open to 4-Hers and others. You don't have to own the lamb but early summer would be a good time to make friends with a lamb, and it's owner, to practice leading the lamb. Check with others in your club to see who might have a lamb you could borrow if you're not enrolled in the project. The lamb's head and/or neck may be decorated, but it may not be blanketed to cover it's body. The participant's outfit is also part of the entry and may be purchased or sewn and must be at least 60% wool. The Make It With Wool contest has had many entries from Greenwood County and there may even be an outfit you could borrow if you don't have one. Your outfit may be a sweater with slacks or jeans, a vest with jeans, a jumper, skirt or dress, or a suit. The judging will be held Sunday, July 28th during the Greenwood County Fair. Pre-entries may be made with open class and will also need a description of the garment and a narrative form for the show. Participants will be evaluated on how well they model their outfit and how well they show the lamb.

Horse ID Papers

Horse ID's are due in the Extension Office by Friday, May 31st. Get one

The Kansas 4-H horse rule book may be found <u>here</u>.

- ⇒ Horse Ownership: Youth may own the horse themselves, or use a family-owned horse (immediate family: parent, stepparent, sibling, grandparent, or legal guardian).
- ⇒ Leasing: The leasing option is intended for youth who do not have access to family-owned horse or who want to expand their participation in the 4-H Horse Project, provided that they manage the horse at least 75% of the time from June 1 through September 30. If a 4-H member leases his or her project horse to another 4-H member, the leaser forfeits the right to use the horse.
- ⇒ Sharing Project Horses: The names of all siblings who intend to show the horse must be listed on the 4-H Horse Identification submitted on or before June 1st. Youth may exhibit the same horse; however the horse cannot participate in the same class in the same age division more than once at a given show. Youth can be in same age division, but they will have to participate in different classes. Youth must share management of the horse.

Dairy Goats at the County Fair!



We are happy to announce that there will be a Dairy Goat Division at the 2024 Greenwood County Fair. Detailed show rules will be released in the Fair Book on June 1st. Animals must be dehorned and debudded. Does must be ADGA or AGS registered.

Registration papers or stamped duplicate registration applications will be required for all registered animals. Animal papers must be in the name of the 4-Hers by June 1 or show ownership by June 1 for grades. Each exhibitor is limited to 4 entries for the entire dairy goat show, with a max of 2 entries per age division (i.e. 2 Jr Does and 2 Sr. Does). Animals without registration papers or legible tattoos, will show with recorded grades, on a bill of sale. Those animals must also be identified by an official USDA Scrapie Premise I.D. tag. - 1. Photography judging will be on Saturday, July 20th starting at 8am. Sign-ups will be on a first come first serve basis in SignUpGenius. If you are exhibiting in the Horse Show, please plan accordingly.
- Do <u>not</u> label your exhibit. Superintendent will place label on exhibits when they are brought in for judging. Keep your bags unsealed.
- Kim Gaines will be sponsoring a photo category "4-H Spirit Photography Special Category Award." One (1) color entry per 4-H member (needs to be enrolled in the photography project) that depicts the spirit and promotion of the 4-H organization. A \$20.00 cash prize will be awarded.

Guidelines are:

- Photos could be selected to go to the state fair under the color category.
- If entering your color photo in the special award there will be a sticker to apply to your entry.
- This is a one winner category.
- All members would acknowledge that the GWCO Extension and Research office and/or ambassadors would use these photos for publication and promotion.
- Upon being selected for these possible projects, a digital file will need to be submitted to the extension office at a later date.
- The photo would not be eligible for open class.
- This would not increase the number of photos a 4-H member could enter at the county level.

4-H/FFA Fair Premium Sale Policy Reminders

This policy is regarding eligibility for the Livestock Sale from the Greenwood County 4-H Foundation:

- Livestock sale participants are required to attend a minimum of 4 monthly meetings.
- The livestock sale is terminal for all animals. Grand and Reserve Grand in each species are required to sell. Fair participants will be limited to one animal in the sale with the exception that in the event that a participant has more than one Grand and/or Reserve Champion, the participant will be required to sell ALL Grand and/or Reserve Champions.
- Requiring all Grand and Reserve Champions to sell ensures the quality and integrity of the program.
- Each fair participant has the right to withdraw their animal from the grand drive if they wish not to sell it.

Each 4-H member who wishes to sell an animal in Greenwood County 4-H Premium sale must:

- 1. Attend at least four monthly meetings of the club in which they are enrolled. Attendance will be counted from October 1st June 30th; with the official record being the 4-H club Secretary.
- 2. Have a signed copy (both 4-H'er and guardian must sign) of the GW Co Fair Livestock Premium Sale Rules on file with the Extension Office by **May 31st!**

Kansas 4-H Insect Spectacular

Mark your calendars for the 2024 Kansas 4-H Insect Spectacular, a two-day state-wide entomology work shop, will be held in person on June 21st - 22nd in Hays, KS. Classes will include basic pinning, basic and ad vanced identification, insect photography, invasive spe cies, pollinator gardens and more. A parent or legal uardian must attend with their 4- H'er. Registration, pro posed schedule, and full information will be coming soon.

4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for Frostings & Fillings

Please note that there was new rule for 4-H Foods & Nutrition changed last year. The new rule is as follows:

⇒ For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety.
